The ITA is an international independent not-for-profit foundation based in Lausanne, Switzerland, that manages anti-doping activities for over 50 international sport organisations including the Olympic Games. It delivers anti-doping programs for International sports Federations (IFs), Major Event Organizers (MEOs) and Anti-Doping Organizations (ADOs) that wish to delegate their anti-doping programs to a body that implements high quality programs with increased transparency and independence. The ITA operates in full compliance with the World Anti-Doping Code.

The ITA Intelligence & Investigations (I&I) Department is now looking for one or more full-time (40 hours per week), part-time (fixed percentage) and/or consultant(s) for the role of:

Intelligence & Investigations Officer

Role description

Reporting to the ITA Head of Intelligence & Investigations (I&I), the ITA **I&I Officer** will be responsible for the delivery of a robust intelligence-driven anti-doping program including the collection, analysis, dissemination, and actioning of intelligence, and responsible for conducting evidence-based fact-finding inquiries into potential or alleged violations of the ITA Partners' anti-doping regulations in an independent, impartial, and confidential manner.

The ITA **I&I Officer** will also work closely with all members of the ITA I&I Department and other ITA staff and will regularly collaborate with other I&I stakeholders. Furthermore, he or she will establish and continually enhance a global network of confidential information sources to implement effective intelligence-led processes and implement investigative methods aimed at achieving results through high performance anti-doping activities.

Key responsibilities

- Conducting intelligence-led procedures to detect, prevent, disrupt, and deter doping activities with a view of building cases to prosecute anti-doping rule violations (ADRVs) under ITA Partners' respective jurisdiction.
- Conducting evidence-based, fact-finding investigative procedures and work collaboratively to implement strategies to advance actionable intelligence towards evidence collection to support the prosecution of ADRVs.
- Gathering, processing, evaluating, and analysing information from all available sources and translate it into actionable intelligence products in support of investigative, result management, and prosecution processes.
- Proactively identifying, recruiting, and managing confidential sources of information pertaining to anti-doping matters handled by ITA on behalf of its Partners.
- Critically evaluating sources to provide a thorough assessment of their credibility and reliability.
- Delivering investigative expertise in the collection of evidence such as forensics and data recovery related to analytical and non-analytical cases pertaining to anti-doping matters handled by ITA on behalf of its Partners.
- Leading, coordinating, and conducting intelligence and/or investigative interviews of athletes, athlete support personnel or any other relevant persons including confidential sources of information who are or may be involved in ADRVs.
- Proactively and reactively exploiting open-source intelligence (OSINT), including social media, to support intelligence operations and ADRV investigations.
- Collaborating regularly with trusted external partners, including but not limited to, the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), regional and national anti-doping organisations (RADOs/NADOs) and international/national law enforcement and intelligence agencies towards sharing intelligence and information in the pursuit of anti-doping cases.

- Developing and implementing multi-departmental anti-doping operations, based on actionable intelligence reporting to combat emerging trends in doping activities.
- Coordinating regularly with counterparts in other ITA Departments (Testing, Science & Medical, Legal Affairs, etc.) to deliver intelligence-led approaches and evidence-based investigative activities across ITA's anti-doping programmes.
- Assessing and coordinating the external passage of sensitive information, upon approval.
- Liaising with other relevant anti-doping and other integrity stakeholders to develop best practices and promote knowledge-based exchanges in the field of intelligence and investigations.
- Delivering comprehensive and objective reports on findings in support of intelligence, investigative, results management, and prosecution processes.
- Contributing to operational or strategic decision-making processes based on intelligence or investigative outcomes and detected *modus operandi* of anti-doping activities.

Skills and experience required

- A dedication to protecting the integrity of sport and its athletes.
- Higher Education degree (or equivalent) in any relevant I&I field (such as but not limited to intelligence studies, criminal sciences or criminology, analysis, law, etc.)
- Minimum of 6 years of extensive experience in leading intelligence operations, law-enforcement investigations, or sports integrity activities at a domestic or international level.
- Well-developed critical thinking, reasoning, and problem-solving skills with attention to detail.
- Extensive experience recruiting, managing, and maintaining confidential human sources.
- Demonstrated expertise in planning and conducting interviews for evidentiary purposes.
- Strong interpersonal, communication, and organizational skills with an ability to manage multiple case files simultaneously in a structured, methodological, and organised manner.
- Familiarity with handling highly confidential and sensitive information; possess impeccable standards of integrity, ethics, and confidentiality. **A previously held or existing security clearance and a passed background checks is desired.**
- Ability to work under pressure and meeting tight and often competing deadlines.
- A team player with a “can do” attitude and is service oriented.
- Excellent English communication skills, both orally and in writing. Knowledge of other languages would be an asset.
- Access to a wide networks of intelligence operators, security, law enforcement and/or prosecution authorities, or forensic experts is an asset.
- Knowledge of the international sport environment, in general, with in-depth knowledge of any ITA partner or other Olympic sports, as well as anti-doping or related integrity activities are an asset.
- Knowledge of the anti-doping movement, its regulatory framework and stakeholders would be a strong asset.
